
There were few books available in the early years. This interior picture, looking towards the rear of the library, was probably taken during the 1940's. Maude Thompson is at the far right. The original lighting and flooring were still in place. The circulation desk was located in about the center of the main floor facing the front door which was being used as the main entrance.

in 1980.



The book return was originally located along Main Street. Unfortunately, books were not always the only items to be "returned." Leo, Haden, maintenance, must decide what to do with the fish. Notice the original front door and the collapsed front steps in the background which date this picture to 1957 or 1958.

The library park in the rear of the building was removed in 1958 to make room for a parking lot. When the building was built in 1914 few people had automobiles and parking was allowed along Main Street.
















Bonnie Neff shows Kathy Uptigrove a snake as part of a 1983 Living Science Foundation program, and today's children are just as interested in animals.







